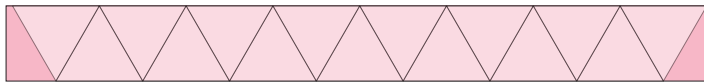
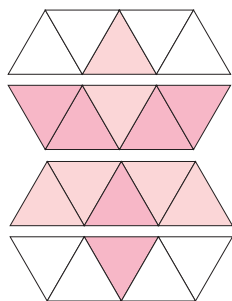


1 Cut three 4½" x WOF strips from each of the eight half yards for the star blocks. Subcut each strip into 4½" triangles until you have 42 triangles of each print. Each strip will yield 15 triangles.

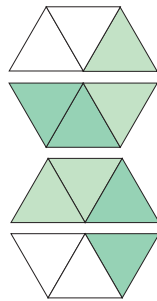
Cut 21 4½" x WOF strips from the background fabric. Subcut each strip into 4½" triangles until you have 304.



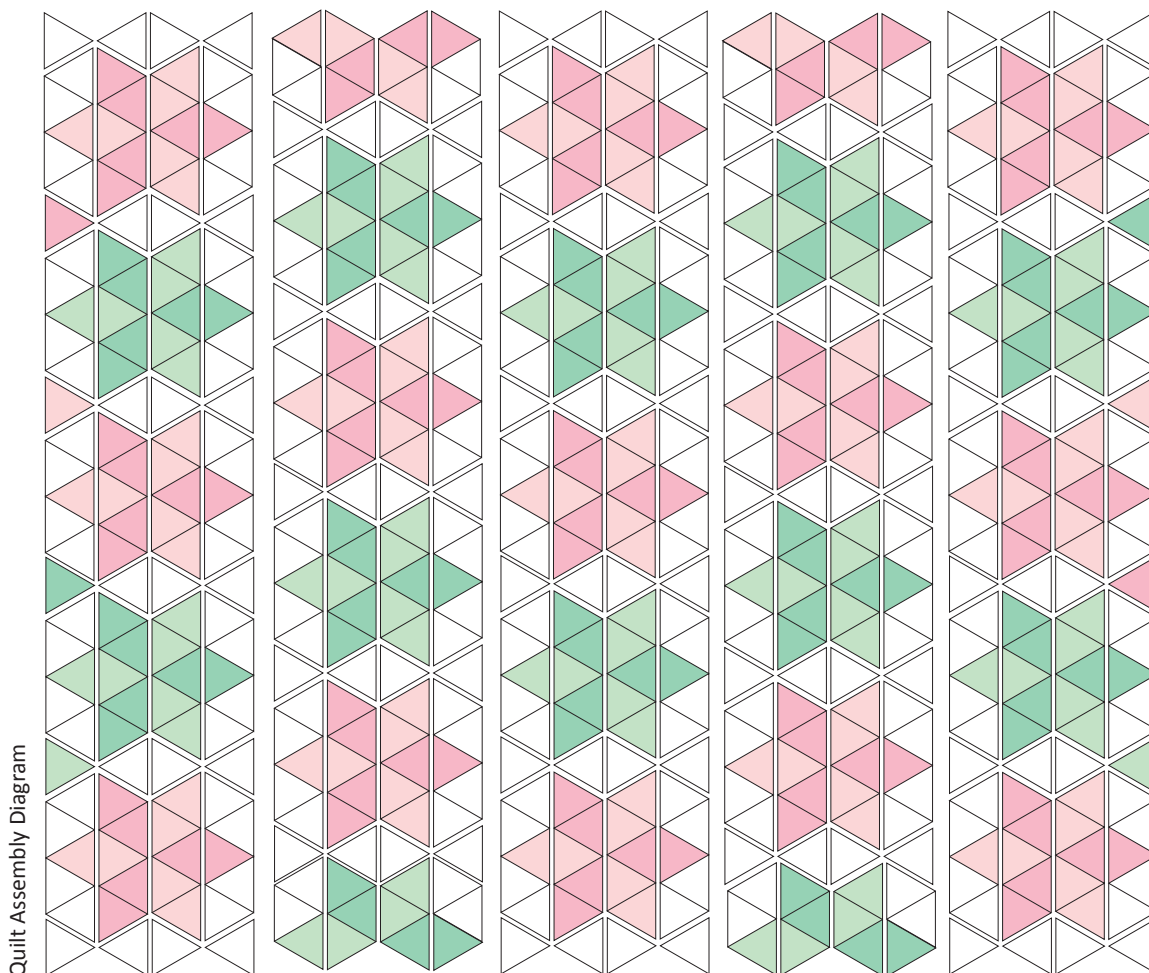
2 Assemble the star block rows. You will need 23 Full Stars and four Half Stars.

Quilt Assembly Diagram

Materials Needed

Lap Size Quilt 55½" x 60"

8 Half Yards for the Star Blocks

2¾ yards Background Fabric

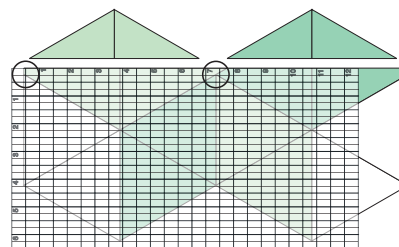
¾ Yard Binding Fabric

3¾ yards Backing Fabric

60° Equilateral Triangle Ruler such as the Creative Grids 60° Double Strip Ruler

3 Assemble the quilt in vertical rows using the Quilt Assembly Diagram below as a guide. Use a background triangle between each star row section.

4 Using a rotary cutter and ruler with ¼" marks trim off the excess from the top and bottom of the quilt. Make sure you leave ¼" seam allowance beyond each point!
