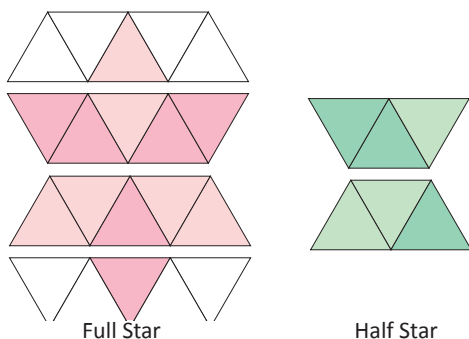


1 Cut three $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips from each of the eight half yards for the star blocks. Subcut each strip into $4\frac{1}{2}$ " triangles until you have 48 triangles of each print. Each strip will yield 15 triangles.

Cut 21 $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips from the background fabric. Subcut each strip into $4\frac{1}{2}$ " triangles until you have 304.

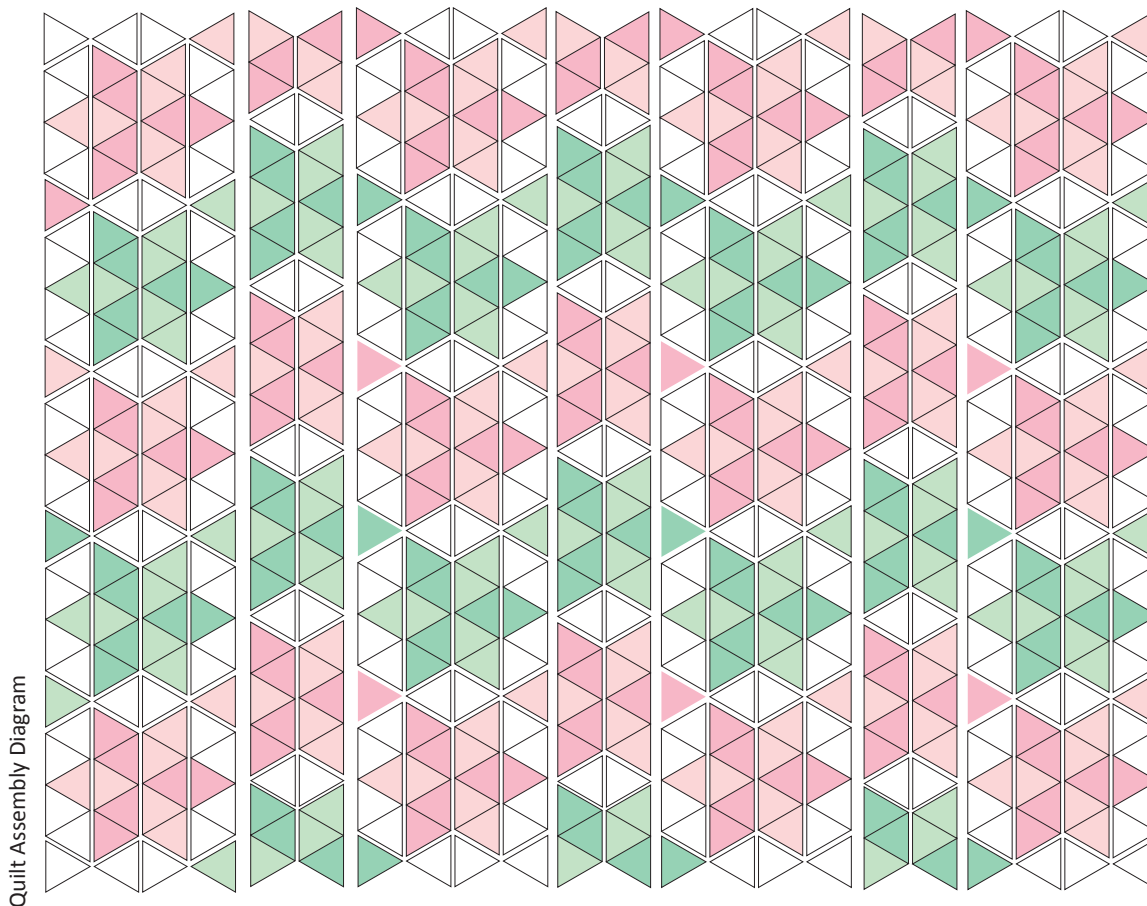
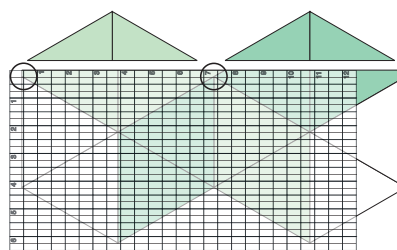


2 Assemble the star block rows. You will need 32 Full Stars and six Half Stars.



3 Assemble the quilt in vertical rows using the Quilt Assembly Diagram below as a guide. Use a background triangle between each star row section.

4 Using a rotary cutter and ruler with $\frac{1}{4}$ " marks trim off the excess from the top and bottom of the quilt. Make sure you leave $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance beyond each point!

Materials Needed
Lap Size Quilt 51½" x 65"
 9 Half Yards for the Star Blocks
 2¾ yards Background Fabric
 ¾ Yard Binding Fabric
 3¾ yards Backing Fabric
60° Equilateral Triangle Ruler such as the Creative Grids 60° Double Strip Ruler
